

Kath's Blackberry Recipes

September and its time to pick Blackberries, that means crumbles and pies, so go ahead, have a go! – Kath

BLACKBERRY FOOL

Dead easy: simply simmer 225g Blackberries with 2 tbsp Sugar until soft, then cool. Fold in the Blackberries to 225ml Crème Fresh and serve in individual glasses, sprinkle with sugar and garnish with a few blackberries.

few more blackberries, slice, serve and enjoy! Kath



BLACKBERRY & ALMOND TRAY BAKE

Line a 21cmx30cm baking with 350g Pastry – bought or home made. Bake 10-15 mins at 180c/gas 4 until pale brown, allow the base to cool. Make a topping by creaming 125g Butter and 125g Sugar, beat in 2 Eggs and fold in 25g SR Flour and 175g Ground Almonds. Spread the base with a generous 4/5tbsp Blackberry Jam and cover with 225g Blackberries. Finally spread the topping over the blackberries and bake 180c/gas4 for 30-40 mins until golden brown, testing with a skewer. Sprinkle with golden brown sugar a few more blackberries, slice, serve and enjoy! Kath



Barry's Blackberry & Lime Bakewell Tart

This month we should be able to buy fresh blackberries, or perhaps you might pick some while walking (safely of course) in the countryside. I'm lucky to have a cultivated bush growing in my garden! Why not have a go at making this tart? I think it's rather good and really tasty. Happy cooking and please continue to stay safe - Barry

FILLING

2 eggs, plus 1 extra yolk
1 teaspoon light soft brown sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
100g butter, melted
100g ground almonds
4 tablespoons blackberry jam or jelly
zest of 1 lime
150g fresh or frozen blackberries (defrosted if frozen)
handful of flaked almonds
icing sugar for dusting

METHOD


Preheat the oven to 180°C/Gas 4. For the pastry sift the dry ingredients into a large bowl and rub in the cold butter with your fingertips until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Or you could use a food processor! Add the egg yolk and water and bring the pastry together quickly with a table knife. If using a processor then pulse to combine. Gather the pastry together, shape into a fat disc and wrap in cling film. Chill for at least 30 minutes. Then take out of the fridge and roll out on a lightly floured surface to the thickness of a £1 coin. Line a deep 20cm fluted tart tin with the pastry. Make sure it goes into the edges and trim away any excess with a sharp knife. Cover with foil and fill with baking beans or uncooked rice. Chill for 30 minutes, then bake for 18 minutes. Remove beans or rice and bake for a further 3-4 minutes until the base has no grey patches. Leave to cool. For the filling, whisk the eggs and yolk, sugar and vanilla with an electric mixer until pale and thick. Add the melted butter and ground almonds, whisk again, then set aside. Mix the blackberry jam and lime zest in a small bowl, then spread over the base of the tart. Top with the defrosted blackberries, then pour over the filling. Sprinkle with flaked almonds, then bake for 35-40 minutes until the filling is just set and golden. Cool for 15 minutes, then remove from the tin. Dust with icing sugar and serve with custard, or double cream, or why not be really indulgent and serve with rich vanilla ice cream. Serves 6-8, if you are lucky!!



PASTRY

160g plain flour, plus extra to dust
1 tablespoon icing sugar
½ teaspoon salt
100g cold butter, cubed
1 egg yolk
½ tablespoon ice-cold water





Months of inactivity were replaced by a plethora of training sessions and matches under Covid related restrictions to provide a seven week truncated season much to the relief of our players and thanks to the valiant efforts of our coaching team and many volunteer helpers and the financial support of Sponsors and VPs.

One month shy of his fourteenth birthday Pip Williams became the sixth youngest player to ever represent our first team in a match at Ruddington CC and at the other end of the scale nine years old Bobby Pope hit a sparkling 38 including seven fours for our Under 11s v Plumtree CC and thirteen years old Eleanor Owen became the first KCC female player to make a Half Century, scoring 65 in an East Midlands Women's League fixture against Derbyshire rivals Ockbrook & Borrowash CC.

Keyworth Lives

Artist, David Ward



David is a relative newcomer to Keyworth, although he has spent many years living in and around the local area. He grew up in Bunny and he recalls how he never knew Keyworth when he was younger because it was on a different bus route! He spent much of his life working as a painter and decorator. However, his talent for painting extends beyond decorating living rooms, he is a very accomplished artist. He was invited to exhibit the oil painting you can see of a rainy day by Trent Bridge at the Royal Academy, Paris. He has also exhibited at the Royal Academy, London. He has for many years exhibited at Nottingham castle and was a member of Nottingham Society of Artists.


David spent many years in Nottingham happily married to his wife June, who sadly passed away in 2018. She was a graphic designer and a talented artist who designed a brass cross that was given by St Mary's Church in the Lace

Market to HMS Nottingham when it was commissioned in 1983.

His talent for drawing was spotted when he was young, although David claims the teachers only told him to draw to keep him quiet! He attended the Junior Art department at Nottingham College of Arts near the arboretum on Clarendon Street and went on to paint many local sites in Nottingham and its surrounding villages. He had a good pedigree of teachers; they were the same teachers who taught the diplomas at the Royal College of Art.

An avid sketcher, David has amassed a huge collection of wonderful drawings (around 800) that capture the people and events he remembers from his childhood in the 1940s, up to the present day. In addition to being brilliant art works in their own right they offer a fascinating and valuable historical account of Nottinghamshire life. There are images of people living everyday life which is often difficult to communicate well in history books, but David's drawings really are vivid and animated. Now I did not know that there was an army camp at Bunny near the end of World War Two, but not only do I now know that, I also have a very good idea of what it looked like and what life was like on the camp as the soldiers and villagers lived side by side.

It's just a shame that we can only show a tiny fraction of David's collection here as it certainly deserves to be seen by more eyes!







Village Hall Complex Now Open

In line with government guidance and coronavirus lockdown restrictions, Keyworth Parish Council facilities were closed in March 2020. We are pleased to announce that from August 2020, the Village Hall complex has re-opened to hirers under new COVID-19 safe conditions.

In addition to the Standard Conditions of Hire, hirers must:

1. Read a copy of Keyworth Parish Council's COVID-19 Risk Assessment and agree to follow the controls outlined in the Risk Assessment.
2. Complete their own Risk Assessment based on the activities that will be carried out during the hiring of the facilities and forward a copy along with the signed booking form.
If your group belongs to an association, the association may be able to provide you with an appropriate risk assessment template. Alternatively, template risk assessments can be found on the Health and Safety Executive website: <https://www.hse.gov.uk/simple-health-safety/risk/risk-assessment-template-and-examples.htm>
3. In order to support NHS track and trace, all hirers must take a register with names, addresses and contact details of all attendees and be able to give full details to track and trace officials.
4. Government guidelines change constantly, so hirers should keep themselves up to date with current guidance, available at: <https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus>

Keyworth Parish Council will monitor and follow government guidelines and reserves the right to amend its terms and conditions with hirers accordingly.

Please remember that we are each ultimately responsible for our own health and safety.
