#### **News from The Friends of Kadzinuni**

Transforming a community in Kenya Moving Forward, Aiming High

In 2006 we completed the construction of Kendrick's Clinic at Kadzinuni. The facility brought primary care to the village for the first time and the building was brought under the Kenya Ministry of Health (MoH) soon after, meaning that nursing staff and all drugs and medical supplies are provided free of charge to the local community. The MoH have also invested in increasing the range of services and have extended the buildings in recent years. However, their budgets do not stretch to regular re-decoration and minor maintenance. In addition, we funded the building of a library, water storage facility and community meeting room adjacent to the Kendrick's Clinic and Kadzinuni Primary School establishing a vibrant heart to the community which has become the focus for transforming Kadzinuni into an educated, busy, self-sufficient wealth generating community.







Working with our local partners of over 20 years, The Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa, in January we funded a major internal and external redecoration and refurbishment project including the repair of floors, windows and doors on all the buildings. This ensures that the facilities built over the last 15 years are maintained in good order. Later in 2021 we will be aiming to undertake some roofing replacement, getting the work done before problems arise, we hope!

#### When is the best time to sell your house?




#### **Keyworth Quiz News**





## Readers' letters

The last weekend in February gave us all some respite from the pandemic with some glorious spring weather, and many people would have been out walking for exercise and preparing their gardens for Spring. However, Saturday afternoon 27 February someone in Keyworth saw fit to light a bonfire and for several hours the air was tainted with the smell of the smoke over a wide area. Bonfires are not illegal (unless burning commercial waste) but they are anti-social and unpleasant. In some cases bonfires can constitute a statutory nuisance. As a retired environmental health scientist, I can advise that bonfires produce carcinogenic and other poisons including dioxins, in addition to the greenhouse gas carbon dioxide. Furthermore, when we have a high pressure weather system and little wind (as we had 28-29 February), air is descending and therefore bonfire smoke spreads sideways instead of dispersing upwards, compounding the problem.

Bonfires are unnecessary as we have the green bin scheme provided at a modest fee from the Council. However, if you must have a bonfire, please leave it until late in the evening and when there is some wind to disperse the pollution, and avoid periods of high barometric pressure and fine weather.



For many years they served on the PCC, June as secretary and David in various roles.








## **Keyworth Lives - Lorraine and Chris**

Hooray!

Taking the time to stand (or sit!) and really see what is happening outside will bring huge benefits to both your garden and you. Noticing what plants are thriving for example or ones that need attention or maybe moving to a more favourable spot and then taking the time to enjoy/nurture/re-home will give you a more fulfilling gardening experience. Giving some newly arrived aphids on your rose a squash before they multiply and run riot saves a lot of time and hassle later. Happily, nature is very forgiving and if things don't quite work out, try again or try something new. Gardening is a lifelong journey of learning, especially in times of changing climate with new circumstances to be faced.

The same principles apply to indoor plants and indeed any animal family members and of course people. Pressing the pause button and taking a long moment to connect to those around us be they family, friends, neighbours, people we meet on a daily basis can, like nature, reveal hidden treasure.

Many of you will have met and know Molly from her time helping me in my shop, Keyworth Carpets. After my father died in 1995 Mum decided to move to Keyworth and it wasn't long before she was helping me in the shop, "keeps me out of mischief", as she used to put it. She used to enjoy walking around the village and going to the library. You would often see her in her garden which she loved and kept neat and tidy. She enjoyed the friendliness of the Keyworth folk and soon settled in. She helped me in my

With the help of good neighbours, some excellent carers, Kevin the gardener, Cathy the hairdresser and the Shopping bus to Morrison's she was determined to have as normal life as possible, living in her own bungalow right to the end. Thank you to you all for helping and caring.

She enjoyed the Tuesday lunch club at the Centenary Lounge run by Doreen Gee, with the help of Margaret Egglestone and a team of lovely people and also The Friendship Club on Thursday at the Methodist Chapel, run by Julie Greenwood and Maureen, with the help of their lovely team.

I would like to say a personal thank you to everyone involved in the running of these two organisations, they meant so much to Mum and are a valuable asset to the Keyworth community.

Although she was a very private person, she often used to say how much she enjoyed living in Keyworth, the friendliness of the people reminding her of the wartime spirit of where she grew up in a sleepy village in Kent.

Mum had a fall on December 28th and after a brush with Covid in hospital, worsening Dementia and general frailty she finally passed away on February 15th 2021.

Thank you to you all for helping to make her life happy for the last 25 years.

She will be missed but never forgotten.

April Recipe

Easter and the traditional Simnel Cake is a must, but remember only 11 balls, which are to represent the 11 faithful disciples - Kath Oakley

#### Simnel Cake

225g Butter 225g Sugar 350g Self Raising Flour 4 Eggs A little Milk to mix 50g Chopped Walnuts 700g Mixed Dried Fruit Apricot Jam 350g Almond Paste



#### Method

Cream together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Stir in the eggs, one by one with a little of the flour, then add the rest of the flour and enough milk to make a dropping consistency. Stir in the walnuts and dried fruit. Pour the mixture into a greased and lined 8 inch cake tin. Bake at 180c/Gas4 for 1 hour, then reduce to 140c/Gas 2 for a further 1 hour. TopTip, I always cover the top of my cakes with a little baking parchment paper to prevent burning. Test with a skewer and when it comes out clean it will be baked. When baked allow to cool then brush the top with Apricot Jam. Roll out the Almond Paste to fit the top of the cake - reserving a little to make into 11 small paste balls which are placed around the edge of the Almond Paste topping, securing with a little Apricot Jam and enjoy!



There is the second of the regional recipes. This one is from our next-door neighbour, Leicestershire. The main ingredient of these pasties is the Red Leicester cheese. It is a hard cow's milk cheese made in much the same way as Cheddar but has a moister, crumblier texture and a milder flavour. It is coloured with a vegetable dye called annatto, which gives the cheese its distinctive deep-orange hue. Happy cooking - Barry

#### Red Leicester, Red Onion And New Potato Pasty

150g Red Leicester cheese,

1 red onion, finely chopped

400g new potatoes, cooked and cut into chunks

1 tablespoon chives, finely chopped

2 tablespoons crème fraiche Salt and freshly ground black

2 eggs, lightly beaten (keep each egg separate)

2 320g sheets of ready-rolled puff pastry

Milk

#### Method

Preheat the oven to 200°C/Gas 6. Mix the Red Leicester, red onion, potatoes, chives, crème fraiche and one beaten egg together in a bowl and season with a little salt and pepper. Cut each of the pastry sheets into two, down the middle. Divide the mixture into four and spoon it on to one side of each of the pastry rectangles, leaving a space around the edges. Dampen the edges with a little milk and fold the pastry over the filling. Round off the corners of each parcel with a knife, then fold the edges over to make a pasty shape (half moon). Crimp the edges together with a fork. Prick the centre of each pasty with the fork, brush with the regaining beaten egg to glaze. Place on a baking tray and bake in the oven for 30 minutes or until golden. Serve hot or cold. For a hot meal I serve with some baked beans or petits pois peas. A mixed salad works well with a cold pasty. Makes 4




