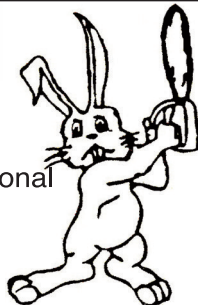

A LOCAL TRIBUTE TO CAPTAIN TOM MOORE

I am a 15-year-old artist and a year 10 pupil from The South Wolds Academy and Sixth Form who's very passionate about art. I started drawing since I could hold a pencil but I started taking it seriously back in 2017. Recently, I became interested in portraiture. I enjoy drawing and experimenting with all different types of faces and features to help improve my skills.

On the 29th of April it was the night before Captain Tom Moore's 100th birthday, although I wasn't aware until my mum mentioned it! Having known about Captain Tom's heroic fundraising efforts, which raised more than £30m for the NHS, I was sparked and inspired into creating a portrait to celebrate his birthday. So early on Thursday morning, the day of Captain Tom's birthday, I got straight to work with my pencils. I was determined to get it finished and posted online that day. The piece took me around two and half hours and I created it with just pure graphite. Initially, I didn't have any intentions or aims for the piece except to share on my art Instagram account, @igartistic, and on my Facebook, just to share with close friends and family. However, after uploading it on Facebook I received lots of requests to publish it to a wider audience, which is when I posted it on the Spotted Keyworth Facebook page. This was when my piece gained more attention and was re-shared by many Royal Air Cadet Pages (I'm part of 2425 Nottingham Tollerton Airport Squadron Air Cadets).

Within an hour of posting my piece, it had gained lots of positive feedback and attention on the page with suggestions I should publish it to an even wider audience - such as the Keyworth News and the BBC [we're so glad you did Aimee!]. A lady even suggested I should auction prints and originals of the drawing in order to raise money for the NHS, which personally, I think is a great idea due to the current pandemic. So now I am busy making plans to start fundraising activities for the NHS by selling my pieces. Hereby I would like to thank my mum & dad, Paula Drury & Steve Brown for their huge support. Bygone Keyworth & Plumtree on old picture postcards by Brian Lund

I love history, on a national, international and micro local level, so I'm always keen to promote pictures that highlight the past. On a postcard posted from Keyworth Post Office on 13th November 1908 by Stella, who lived on Highfield Road, addressed to Miss Belton on Dame Agnes Street, Nottingham, was the message: "Am hoping to come to Nottm on Saturday morning for some shopping, returning 1.10. Should you be able to come back with me? If so, be in the Mid Station booking hall not later than 1pm". Stella would have been able to walk down to the railway station at Plumtree by footpath from Highfield Road (quite close) or walk down Nottingham and Station Roads (about a mile).



This is the station that our Stella would have travelled to Nottingham from in 1908. The last passenger train called at Plumtree on 28th February 1949, though test trains run through here still. Amazing to think you could once travel direct to London from Plumtree. The building on the left, the old station booking hall and waiting room etc., has been Perkins Bar & Bistro for many years. In

the distance on the left is the old engine shed, now the Carriage Hall, a great wedding venue. The signal box on the right is no longer here.

This postcard, published by a Doncaster firm, was sent from Plumtree on 13th March 1923 to Miss Penn in Forest Fields, Nottingham. Gladys, who wrote it, began her message "The air out here is beautiful..." Still is! Image to add

Talking of Plumtree, did you know it also had a windmill at one time? It stood on the hill



above the cricket field near the path to Flawforth. It was burned down in 1909 by some local youths who were annoyed that the local magistrate, Mr Turner (who owned the mill, and also the Griffin pub) had recently fined them in court.

The windmill in Keyworth, on Selby Lane, was built in 1820 and lasted a little over 100 years. The first postcard, published by Peter Attewell at the village post office, was sent from Keyworth on 30th December 1910 by Leonard to his Mum in New Basford. *"Am coming home tonight by the 6.39 train. Arrive Nottingham about 7"*. At this time the mill was owned by the Eggleston family. Another card I have, posted at Nottingham and sent to Ponders End on 19th April 1928, shows the mill with most of its sails removed, and further down the road the Infant school. *"It has snowed today"*, wrote Dorothy. *"This is the village a mile away from where I am staying at. I am having a lovely time"*. The mill was demolished in 1958. Pity it's not still here - we could have done with it during lockdown! The house where it stood is now 'Mill House'. The windmill has become the village symbol, used first by the Parish Council in 1968 but since adopted by various clubs and organisations. Maybe the first of these was Keyworth Rugby Football Club in 1976 when Terry Richards designed a version.



More of Selby Lane, with a picture of the sweetshop. It dates from around 1905, when it was a general store owned by Tommy Tomlinson. The shop was bought by the Lever family in the mid-1920s and was still there in the 1970s. Anyone know when it closed?

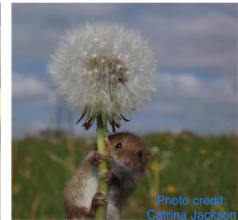

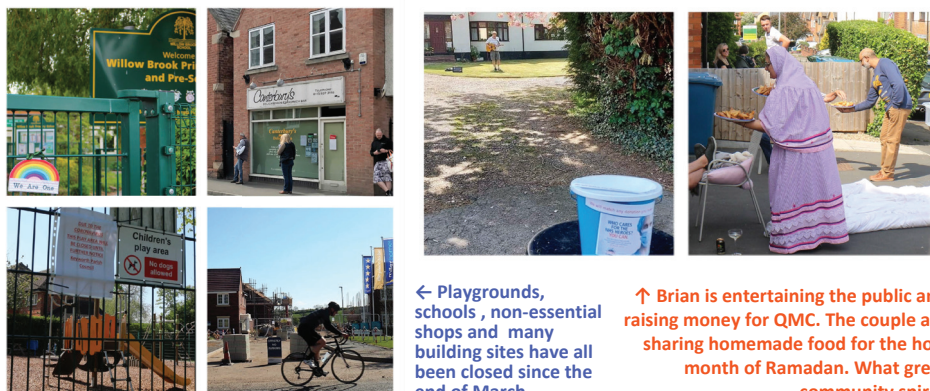

2425 (NOTTINGHAM AIRPORT) SQUADRON AIR CADETS

2425 Squadron has continued to operate through the last month providing activities and training to young people in our communities. Of course, all actual face to face activities and parades have ceased, but using imagination and everyday technology we have continued in the best traditions of the corps.

We have maintained our weekly parades, but instead of meeting at our HQ these have been undertaken through linking up via computer and smart phones. In this way we have provided a variety of activities in virtual evening parades.

We have run quizzes, lessons, PT sessions, Aircraft Recognition training.

Most recently the cadets received a presentation in deaf awareness and introduction to British Sign Language. We additionally invited cadets from across the Wing to take part in this parade and were joined on the night by cadets from a number of squadrons. The cadets were taught to sign their own names, introduce themselves and the signs for family members.

The cadets have also undertaken aero modelling, with the staff producing tutorial videos to help many who have never built a plastic model kit before. We started with a simple Supermarine Spitfire and for the second build the cadets moved onto a tougher RAF Red Arrows Hawk. It has been great to see so many cadets build these aircraft and I am sure it will be quite a sight when we return to parading at our HQ and these aircraft are all brought together.

One of the highlights of the last month though must be our video. The cadets and staff have put together a number of fun videos over the last month, but one brought many cadets together virtually to act in one combined film. The cadets were asked to film a small snippet of themselves at home, then after transforming into uniform the virtual baton, in the shape of a cadet logbook, was passed on and on again from cadet to cadet. This was all edited together and uploaded to Facebook.

At the time of writing our little film has more than 17 thousand views and it is really worth checking out via our Facebook page.

We already have plans for another film and many more fun activities that we can deliver to the cadets both during our weekly virtual parades and in projects for the cadets to undertake at their leisure.

We are truly proud of our cadets and the way that many are stepping up and to quote the third aim of our organisation, show their 'qualities of leadership and good citizenship'.

There are so many we could list but for this month I will name just two.

Cpl Brown who created a lovely picture of Col Tom Moore in celebration of his 100th Birthday, which was shared widely (please see article on page 5), and Cdt Dack who has been producing scrubs wash bags for the NHS at home during this period.

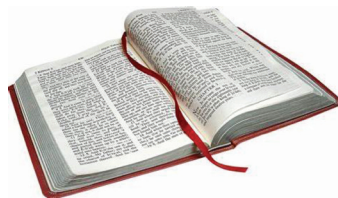

"Our premises are closed, but 'The Church' is alive - it has just left the building!"

Toddler Praise which is for preschool children and their parents and carers, last met on March 13th. Since then, Wednesday Morning Toddlers, the Y? Young People's group and the X-Site group have fallen foul of the 'Lockdown'. Easter Time Travelling, involving children from years 1 and 2 from local schools, was cancelled along with Good Friday and March 19th Messy Church. What a bleak prospect, given the unknown future as far as the Coronavirus was concerned.

Those involved with young people and their families needed to step up to the plate and carry on providing worship experiences, offering pastoral care and showing that God's love is extended to all, no matter what the circumstances. It has been a steep learning curve in using the positive aspects of Social Media including Facebook, Zoom and You Tube.

The Y? Youth group began again on April 26th and have continued with Zoom meetings following the 'Youth Alpha' Faith course, alternating with quizzes and 'Taskmaster' activities. Safeguarding using Zoom with young people has been risk assessed and parents and children advised of their responsibilities.

Wednesday Toddlers is now a Facebook 'virtual' group when messages of support are exchanged and soon they hope to introduce a singing and story time on Zoom. Toddler Praise has also moved to Facebook and every Friday is able to meet 'on line' using Zoom at 10 o'clock when songs are actively enjoyed, a bible story is told, prayers are said and a craft is suggested. These sessions are on You Tube for the rest of the week. It is so pleasing to see the smiling faces of the children and their parents and to see young people engaged in their activities.

Our churches are providing ways of keeping connected with 'on line' services along with 'telephone' worship. The Methodist Church has produced a weekly bulletin called 'Keeping Connected' that is circulated by email and paper copies and can be found on the church website. Do look at all the websites and join in with worship and suggested activities for old and young alike.

COVID-19 Mutual Aid

We have been incredibly heartened by the hundreds of people across the village who have volunteered both directly to us and within the street where they live.

Thanks to you, Keyworth has reached the amazing position of having a local coordinator “looking out” for every street in the village.

These street level coordinators are supported by 10 area coordinators who have worked tirelessly to ensure nowhere in the village is missed out. You should already have received a leaflet telling you of your street’s contact details; if not, and you need help, please contact the Parish Council.

Our initial system has now evolved, and whilst the Parish Council continues to act as a central point of contact, requests for help and volunteers can now be handled directly in your neighbourhood, matching up volunteers in a street with their neighbours, for assistance with shopping, prescriptions or just a friendly hello.

It seems we are all starting to get to know our neighbours a little better; the Thursday night ‘clap for our carers’ certainly gets people smiling and talking from their front gardens, and Keyworth celebrated VE Day 75 in style!

- If you need support with shopping, prescriptions or a call, then contact your street coordinator and they will be able to help you.*
- If you have volunteered but have not yet been asked to help anyone, contact your street coordinator directly – tell them you are on the Parish Council volunteer list.*
- If you would like to volunteer and still haven’t, please contact your street coordinator. There is no limit on volunteers!*
- If you have been asked to help more than one family and this is proving difficult, contact your street coordinator. They can find volunteers to support you.*
- As lockdown changes it is clear many of us may be asked to urgently self-isolate for a period of time so your street support network is important to all of us.*
- If you have any concerns then please contact the Parish Council (details below).*

It is hoped that this street-based system will become self-sufficient in the future and that Keyworth’s network of neighbourliness and mutual support will continue to exist long after the coronavirus crisis has passed.

Who knows what the future will bring, but we do know that this crisis has shown that we can all pull together and care for each other. Stay safe!

Keyworth's Front Line Virus Battle

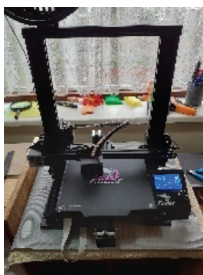
There is a rich, well documented tradition in Keyworth for cottage style industry and production going back centuries. There has surely been no greater testament to this heritage than the work of the Nottingham Face Shields group, set up by Claire Giles in the village, to produce and donate plastic visors for free, to local NHS and key workers.

At a time of great challenge to us all, Claire and her team of volunteers, fuelled by the help of donations from our community, have been increasing day by day their capacity and delivery, truly making a difference on the front line of Nottingham's fight against Coronavirus.

Keyworth Parish Council made space available for production to aid the drive for increased production; the community has pledged financial support, and plenty of moral support through the Facebook page and other channels: <https://www.facebook.com/nottsshieldsnhs>

Claire said *"I've been overwhelmed both by the response from people wanting to join the group and help us to produce more visors, and by pledges from the community to enable us to donate everything we produce for free."*

The process involves '3D Printing', which for those less familiar with it, involves making a physical object from a three-dimensional digital model, typically by laying down many thin layers of a material in succession. Claire told us *"The visors are completely reusable and can be sterilised with solution (as per instructions that we send through) AND we have it on good authority that they're very comfy!"*



Up to May 11th 4,280 face shields have been delivered and more than £1,250 donations have been made. In addition, again in keeping with that proud Keyworth production heritage, Claire's thoughts are on continuing the fight: *"Thanks to some incredible people responding to my plea for help with printing, we have now built a small army and can produce in the region of 15,000 visors per week. So if anyone out there can help to donate anything at all, we can ensure everyone who needs a visor in our local community will get one. If you know anyone who needs a visor who cannot get access to one, we will ensure they want no more!"*

Mental wellbeing while staying at home

Taking care of your mind as well as your body is important while staying at home because of coronavirus (COVID-19).

You may feel bored, frustrated or lonely. You may also be low, worried or anxious, or concerned about your finances, your health or those close to you.

It is important to remember that it is OK to feel this way and that everyone reacts differently. Remember, this situation is temporary and, for most of us, these feelings will pass. Staying at home may be difficult, but you are helping to protect yourself and others by doing it.

Helping children and young people cope with stress

There are some key points you can consider about how to support your child or young person, including:

Listen and acknowledge: Children and young people may respond to stress in different ways. Signs may be emotional (for example, they may be upset, distressed, anxious, angry or agitated);

behavioural (for example, they may become more clingy or more withdrawn, or they may wet the bed), or physical (for example, they may experience stomach aches).

Look out for any changes in their behaviour. Children and young people may feel less anxious if they are able to express and communicate their feelings in a safe and supportive environment. Children and young people who communicate differently to their peers may rely on you to interpret their feelings. Listen to them, acknowledge their concern and give them extra love and attention if they need it.

While we are experiencing this 'lockdown' I will continue to try and share recipes that require mostly store cupboard staples. This pasta bake is quite easy to make as well as being very tasty. Happy cooking and please keep safe - Barry



PUTTANESCA PASTA BAKE

olive oil

2 garlic cloves, sliced

1 red chilli, finely chopped

75g pitted black olives, sliced

50g capers, drained

2 x 400g tin chopped tomatoes

70g tin (or from tube) of concentrated tomato purée

300g pasta of your choice (use shapes e.g. penne or spirali)

158g tin tuna, drained and flaked

100g mozzarella (or cheddar), grated

Heat a slug of olive oil in a large deep frying pan. Fry the sliced garlic and chopped red chilli over a low-medium heat for 2 minutes. Stir in the olives, capers, tinned tomatoes, tomato purée and half a tin of water (use one of the tomato tins). Season with black pepper and a little salt, bring to the boil, then simmer over a medium heat for 15 minutes. Heat the oven to 200C/Gas 6. Cook the pasta according to the pack instructions in a large saucepan of boiling salted water until al dente (about 9 minutes). Drain, reserving a cup of the cooking water, then stir into the tomato sauce along with the tuna and a little of the saved cooking liquid. Pour the mixture into a large baking dish and scatter over the cheese. Bake for 20 minutes until piping hot and the topping is golden. Serve with fresh basil leaves scattered over the top. A side salad goes well with this. Serves 4. A glass (or two!) of a light Italian red wine would go down well with this dish.

Rhubarb & Orange Jam

Its Rhubarb time now and this can be made quite quickly in the Microwave. So wipe and dice 2 sticks of Rhubarb (259g) and place in a large Pyrex bowl with the zest and juice of 1 orange and microwave on full power for 4/5 mins until the rhubarb has softened. Then stir in 250 g sugar and 1 tsp butter until dissolved. (Some folks like to add a half teasp of dried Ginger Powder at this stage, but its optional) Microwave on full power for 3 mins, stir and cook for a further 3 mins. Carefully remove (it's hot) and pour into a clean jam jar.

Asparagus

Asparagus has a short season and it's quick to cook. Simply cut to a similar length, and gently simmer in hot water 5 mins or until tender, drain and eat with melted butter salt, and pepper - the kids will enjoy nibbling along the length of the stalk until they get to the juicy tip.



New Potatoe Salad, Walnuts & Lemon dressing

New potatoes are coming into season, so

- 225g New Potatoes
- 1 Medium Apple, chopped
- 50g Walnut Pieces
- 285g Crème Fraiche
- 1 tabsp Vinegar
- 1 tabsp Lemon Juice
- 3-4 Grilled Bacon

Simply wash and cook the potatoes 10-15 mins with their skins on and when cool place in a bowl and add the chopped apple and dress with the Crème

Fraiche, Vinegar & Lemon juice. Top with chopped bacon and enjoy with French bread.



Strawberries

This flan is dead easy for the Kids. Simply buy a pastry or sponge flan - whichever your family like best. Spread with 400g Crème Fraiche (more or less - it all depends how much you like). Then slice a punnet of Strawberries in half and place on top of the Crème Fraiche to decorate the flan. Finally, melt 3-4 tabsp of Strawberry Jam with a little water and glaze the strawberries and again, enjoy.

You will have noticed that the “Spinners Croft” (no punctuation!) development of ‘... 2 bedroom bungalows, and 2, 3 and 4 bedroom houses’ by Miller Homes on Platt Lane/Station Road got underway in October, but construction ceased in mid-March due to the Coronavirus.

The large gap created in the hedge at the bottom of Nicker Hill which had been replanted seems to be growing well....

after intermittent diversions and closed roads and men in high visibility jackets and hard hats, all is currently quiet on and around the site.

Our village is expanding

Housing developments will occur on the periphery of the village, in the former Green Belt (all our brown field sites having already been utilised).

The current glorious weather and diminished volume of traffic gives an excellent opportunity to record the changes to our community, for our archive, as a record of these strange times, for the future.

This mood is good news for Keyvolution, & very much fits with our aims of helping the community help itself to be more sustainable & self-supportive at a local level. We think the many skills that the population have revealed during lockdown, the robust support network that has been created here & the large number who have been successfully working from home might well lead to some significant long-term changes.

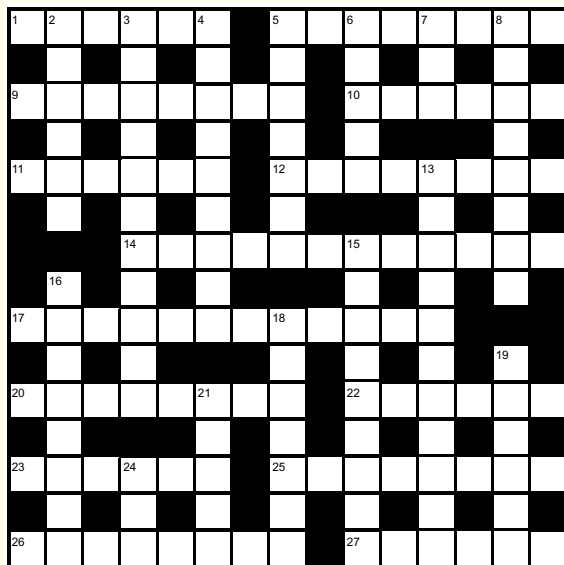

KEYWORTH CRICKET CLUB (1815-2020)



Whilst the resumption of cricket remains understandably far from clear and certain, and with the professional game suspended to July 1, the recreational game (non-professional) also awaits further direction. The KCC Club Committee have agreed and circulated to all members a 22 point action plan that would hopefully enable training and match play to commence within 72 hours of the Government & Cricket authorities giving permission. The plan relates to all Adult & Junior activities and our programme for Disability & Walking Cricket, Schools and All Star Beginners as well as the Social Cricket community.

In the interim, KCC has maintained regular and interactive contact with the membership of its Facebook pages through quizzes, exercise advice, memorabilia, photos and information updates and the social chat and banter has been lively with some surprises. One being from the Archivist of the famous Heriots Academy in Scotland, which resulted in a heartening but ultimately sad story of William Andrew Pike. William was a Keyworth cricketer who was engaged as only Heriot's second ever 'professional' in 1896, a role he fulfilled until 1906 as coach, player and groundsman until sadly one day he fell from a train travelling from Edinburgh on to the line near Hawick whilst journeying back to Keyworth. Severely injured, he survived for many months before passing away at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary on 10 July 1907. Paid 28 shillings a week and house provided to live in with coal supplied for heating, he had suffered the loss of his wife Sarah, nee Armstrong, in February 1906 from complications after a heart operation aged 41. This moving and interesting story is a welcome addition to KCC's History and will be added to www.keyworthcrickethistory.co.uk

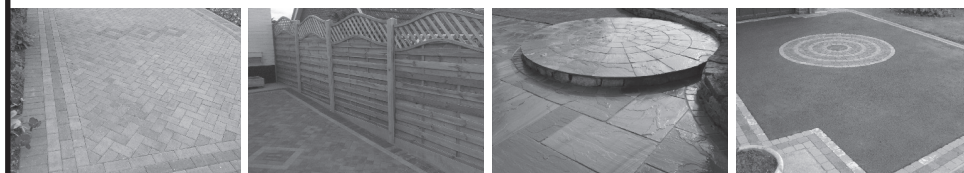

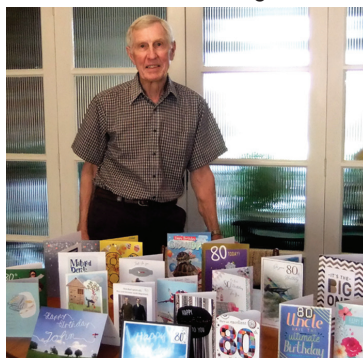

Want to join in? Here are some guidelines for you to follow:

- DO:**
- Address the letter to 'Dear Friend' and share general information about yourself - job, hobbies, garden, seasonal (the daffodils blooming in your garden, visiting birds etc)
 - Do offer some reminiscence opportunities - favourite places, food, childhood memories
 - Postcards are nice with pictures of gardens, animals, artworks, coastal views etc - all help to stimulate conversations and memories

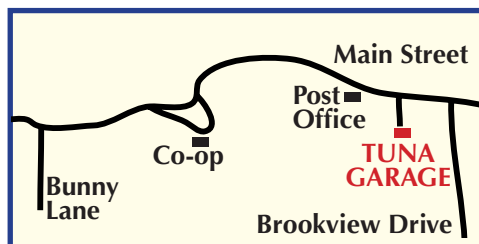

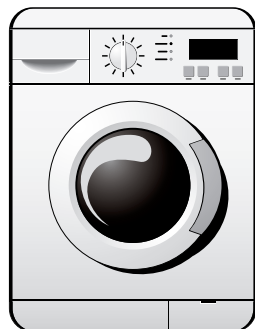

Be alert to fraud during this pandemic

How to protect your finances from fraudulent activity during these uncertain times

The conditions we're experiencing now, we have never seen in our lifetimes. But the present does have several things in common with previous periods of turbulence: we are currently living through a climate of uncertainty, confusion and fear - and these are ideal times for criminals to take advantage of us.

While the chances of being targeted by a financial scam remain low, the consequences of falling victim can be devastating. Knowing what to look for, what to do and what not to do will help keep you safe.

The scams we're seeing

The global financial crisis came with an increase in fraudulent activity such as 'phishing' scams. These seek to trick people into disclosing personal information, such as bank account numbers and passwords, that could result in identity theft or financial loss.

The coronavirus outbreak has seen a similar rise in fraudulent activity. Particularly prominent are scams in which criminals aim to exploit trust in public bodies by imitating them in order to obtain personal information or money.

The prospect of an economic slowdown may also increase the risk of criminals promoting unsafe and unregulated investment and pension opportunities.

What we can do as individuals

If you're not sure if a communication has come from a trusted source it claims, the customer services support of the genuine organisation is there to help with any concerns or queries. Always look those contact details up rather than following a link in a suspect communication. Expect waiting times to be longer than usual. And if in doubt, don't respond: genuine providers don't need you to make a quick decision, or act immediately.

Remember

- No legitimate individual or organisation would ever ask you for information such as bank account numbers or login details
- Banks will never ask clients to transfer money or move it to a safe account
- Banks, HMRC, the police, the government, regulators and other bodies never cold call people asking for some form of banking identification

- Don't give your personal or financial details to anyone you don't know or don't trust
- If you're going to update your information or make payments, always log in to your account
- Hang up if you're ever cold called about an investment opportunity; it's almost certainly a high-risk investment or a scam

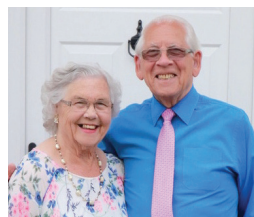

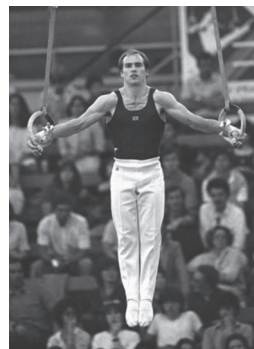
SOUTH NOTTS SHOTOKAN KARATE CLUB

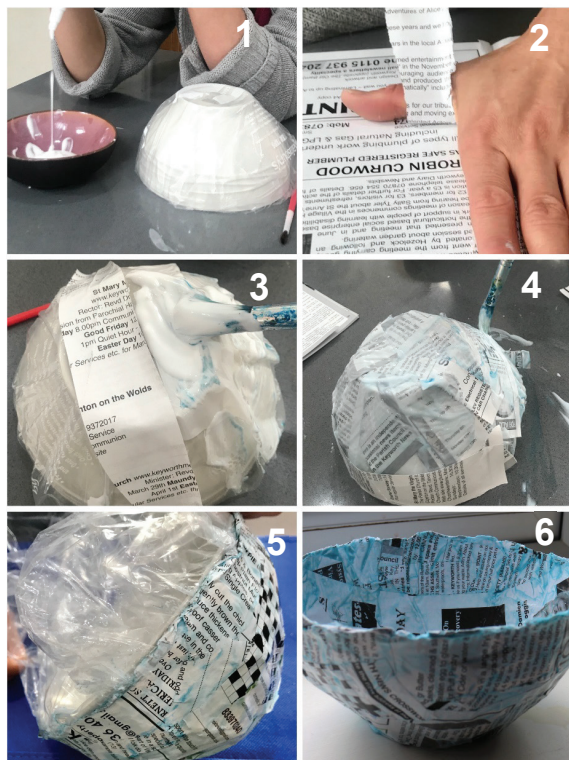


KEYWORTH KIDS

To celebrate World Environment Day on 5 June, let's do a 'Trash to Treasure' project. Up Cycle Your Old Magazine Into An Artsy Bowl.

Materials: PVA glue, cling film, a paint brush, a bowl as a mould.

Note: leave the finished paper bowl to dry overnight before peeling off the cling film.



1. Wrap your chosen bowl in clingfilm (this will be your mould).
2. Tear an old newspaper or magazine into strips
3. Coat the wrapped mould in glue and start to cover with the paper strips
4. Add layers of papers strips and glue so the walls of bowl are at least 2mm thick
5. Leave the bowl to dry overnight
6. Check the bowl is dry and then carefully remove the paper bowl from the mould.

KEYWORTH LIVES - CLAIRE GILES

It's brilliant what you're doing, what motivated you and how did you go about starting this whole initiative?

I was talking with my sister, who works in a care home, about what she had to wear while at work. Her care home had done a wonderful job of providing masks and gloves, but she wondered if there was any additional protection available. I was doing a google search and reading about the PPE shortage and that everything is being transferred to the NHS and Frontline workers, I said to my sister leave it with me!

How did you know what equipment was in short supply? And how did you find the parts that were needed and how to assemble it?

I found an online network of people from all the UK that was organising PPE supply and joined the group to find out more. I noticed a guy in the group was from Nottinghamshire, his name was Graham and he worked in 3D printing. His knowledge of 3D printers was outstanding and I'm a natural organiser. So together we came up with a plan and simple design we could deliver using basic materials. I then setup Facebook, and GoFundMe pages seeking support to help us to provide these for free. I investigated further on what materials were needed, and with a little trial and error we now have the perfect design and my sister's care home received 20 face shields!

You've got an amazing production line - can you tell us about the different processes that are undertaken here?

The headsets are made by eleven volunteers on a total of 15 3D printers using my own design. Our driver, Jamie, delivers them to the Village Hall where we assemble them. We stress test the printed headsets first before attaching the plastics visors. Then we have several stages of sterilisation, including, soapy water, alcohol and UV light. Finally, we apply an anti-fog coat to the visor. I then box them and label each box so that they are only opened three days after delivery. It's a long process but worthwhile.

How many face shields do you produce a week and where do they go to?

We produced on average 600 a week and have so far donated around 4280 [as of mid-May]. We supply the City Hospital, QMC, Kings Mill Hospital, GPs, cares home and local shops.

Is there anything more that Keyworth residents can do to help - more volunteers or equipment for example?
