Santa And Sleigh Visits To Keyworth

With the continuing uncertainty over the spread of coronavirus the Rotary Club has decided, as last year, to limit the visits and charity collections in Keyworth and other local villages.

The first responsibility of the club is to the safety of our members, volunteers and the public and so no door-to-door collections will again be made this year.

We will, however, continue the tradition of the sleigh parading round our streets with two tours of the village on Thursday and Friday 16 and 17 December. The Thursday tour will cover the west of the village to include Main Street, Brook View and roads off Manor Road, Debdale and Crossdale Drive. The Friday tour will cover the east of the village to include Beech Avenue, and roads off Mt Pleasant and Wolds Drive. The sleigh will be on the move on each night from 5pm. Although we shall not be knocking door to door, we will still have collectors with buckets following the sleigh so.... if you do wish to make a donation please call or signal to the collectors as they pass.

We have also made arrangements to hold static collections in December at various venues including Morrisons in Gamston and NotCutts at Edwalton. More locally the sleigh will be located at the Co-operative Supermarket Car Park on the Parade on Friday 17 December from 11am until 5pm if you wish to come along and see us. On Saturday 4 December the sleigh will also be at the Village Hall Car Park from 4pm as part of the Festivities Day.

The club is very grateful to the people of Keyworth who support the Rotary Club so generously each festive season. Every donation made goes into the Benevolent Fund and is used to support good causes both in our local community and beyond.

3rd Keyworth Guides' Fascinate challenge



Girlguiding Midlands has created a brilliant challenge based on STEM activities – that's Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. Before half term the Guides had a go at a number of activities to complete the badge.



My favourite activity was making paper rockets. These flew really well, and the instruction video was delivered by a group of engaging young women who worked at RAL Space, the UK Space Testing facility, who also told us about their jobs at RAL Space.

The Guides also grew their own rainbows, used origami to make a 3D double helix to learn about the structure of DNA, and made two types of pulley systems from cereal boxes, string and washers to show how much effort is used to lift things.

However the Guides were at their most impressive making bridges from paper. They were challenged to make a bridge from only paper and Sellotape, and then test it with different objects to see how strong it was. We started with fairly light items such as a pen, and a spoon, and worked up to apples. Many of the Guide's bridges supported five apples, which we thought was remarkable – we clearly have some potential engineers in the unit.

We were also impressed with some out of the box thinking when one Guide asked if she could use a piece of wood to make her bridge as paper was made out of wood!

We're looking forward to awarding some well earned badges.

The last month has seen the Squadron cadets achieve great things in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme with two expedition groups successfully completing three-day navigation expeditions. The cadets successfully navigated from the village of Wysall to the first nights a campsite where tents were pitched and the evening meals cooked.

The next morning saw heavy rain and tents were quickly taken down and donning waterproofs, the cadets set off on their second day of walking. This second day took the cadets into the Vale of Belvoir on footpaths which got increasingly muddy as the rain persisted throughout the day.

Fortunately, on arrival at the second nights campsite the skies cleared and rain stopped, giving the cadets the opportunity to dry equipment, set up the nights camp and cook their evening meal in the dry.

The third days walking saw the cadets make their way to the finish at the Squadron HQ and completion of their Silver DofE expedition.

All that remains is for the cadets to give a presentation on the expedition to their peers and staff and then onwards to the Gold Award.

Goose Fair used to be synonymous with cold, damp mornings and mountains of leaves to be kicked through. We're over a month behind almost like Autumn is waiting for something, (maybe the outcome of COP26?)

It's harder to ignore climate change now as increasing numbers of people are re-connecting with the natural world; whether through having more time, for health reasons, or through concern at what they are witnessing personally and via the news. How many of us feel powerless to do anything about climate change? Isn't it the Government's job to make change happen? When will they?

Nottinghamshire Sports Club Bowled Over by County Council Funding

Delighted members of a Nottinghamshire sports club have been bowled over after receiving much-needed funding to make vital improvements to their facilities. Keyworth Bowls Club has installed new banks, ditches and a sprinkler system which will enable the sport to continue to be played safely on its Elm Avenue green for many years to come. They have replaced the original crumbling banks and ditches, which had been in place since the club opened in 1964 and had become a serious risk to bowlers' safety.

Nottinghamshire County Council contributed £19,026 towards the project via its Local Improvement Scheme (LIS), with the total cost of the improvement work being £38,052. Councillor John Cottee, chairman of the communities committee at the county council and Keyworth Division member, said: "Keyworth Bowls Club is at the heart of the local community and plays a key role in bringing people together in the area.

"Therefore, I am absolutely delighted that through the Local Improvement Scheme we've been able to help this wonderful club carry out much-needed work to help preserve its future for many years to come. Bowls is a sport which can be enjoyed by players of all ages and I really hope the improvements which have taken place at the club encourages even more people to take it up. The Local Improvement Scheme was introduced to support projects which put the community at the centre of their activities, and Keyworth Bowls Club certainly does this. I would like to wish the club all the very best for the future and look forward to bowls being played again when the new season starts next spring."



More than 800 people use the club's facilities seven days a week during the summer, providing benefits from a mental health viewpoint and helping to combat loneliness and isolation. The club, which has 73 members, hosts regular weekly indoor games nights, coffee mornings and social events during the close season, enabling the 'coming together of people' all year round.

Alan Jackson, Keyworth Bowls Club's committee fundraiser, said he was delighted the county council had provided the funding to help cover the costs of the improvements.

He said: "We've been looking at doing this for several years but never had the funding to carry out the work, which was so badly needed. We have an excellent reputation of having one of the best facilities in the county, but the banking was so bad it had become a health and safety hazard because all the wood was cracking. However, thanks to the support of Nottinghamshire County Council and Cllr John Cottee we have been able to successfully carry out the work which has enabled us, as a club, to keep going. They have been brilliant throughout the whole process and I would recommend anyone looking to secure funding for projects like this to contact the county council. We are very much a community club and without this funding and support, we wouldn't be able to provide the obvious benefits of helping people to get out of their homes and participate in open air sport."

Its December, but no time for rest!

We as gardeners are always looking forward to the next season, and you may well be forgiven for thinking that the darker winter months provide us with a chance to rest, but you would be wrong!

We, like many people who spend a lot of time outdoors, are very aware of what's happening in nature, noticing the changing of the seasons and how the landscape changes over the year. Unfortunately, climate change is something we are all familiar with and it seems so much more evident when we look at how the trees are holding on to their leaves for so much longer, how late the dahlias are flowering before the frosts blacken their leaves and those perennials we have cut back ready for winter are starting to grow again. All this means we are still having to tend and tidy our plots rather than hunkering down indoors.

During December, we will also be busy making wreaths and we have a couple of workshops planned, where we will be using natural local materials to create bespoke festive decorations. We will also be at the Keyworth Festivities Day which will be a great community event on 4th December and hope to chat to lots of people then.

Until next year, when we hope that all the t's will be crossed and the i's dotted and our community garden will be under way, have a very happy Christmas!

GARDEN JOBS FOR DECEMBER

Make sure your perennials are cut back but leave any hollow stems as these encourage beneficial insects to creep in to keep warm.

Leave some seed heads and grasses and flowers such as sedums to provide architectural structure to a frosted winter garden.

Mulch the borders to protect the crowns of tender plants..

Plant trees and shrubs or a hedge instead of using fencing. Bare root and root ball specimens are usually much cheaper than those which are pot grown.

Sweep up fallen leaves on driveways and paths before they become slippery.

Put out a bug house for overwintering insects and solitary bees.

What to look out for this month...

Look for interesting winter fungi which are more visible now as surrounding vegetation dies down.

Help hibernating hedgehogs by providing a bespoke shelter (Wildlife Trusts provide instructions) or just by leaving a pile of logs or compost.

Numbers of starlings peak from December to January and as a result, fantastic murmurations can often be seen at dusk as they prepare to roost. Try visiting Holme Pierrepont and you may spot one of these fantastic displays in the sky.

Make a bird table or put up a feeder to help birds survive the winter.

Dark December days mean that grey squirrels can be seen gathering as much of the remaining food they can in a short time.

If you're lucky, you might see a barn owl flying silently over the fields late in the afternoon.

This month we hear from brilliant local triathlete, Sophie. Sophie moved to Keyworth when she was five and attended Crossdale School. She was involved in sport from an early age - she'd already had swimming lessons in Kent so carried these on at Keyworth pool with her new swimming teacher, Mary. She has always loved running too, and took part in several school cross country events that were held across the county.

When she was eight, her mum entered her into the Clifton triathlon and she was truly hooked. Soon after, she joined 4Life Tri Club and the Nottingham Leander Swimming Club. Those were really fun times for Sophie, meeting up

with her friends every week and travelling to the various races up and down the UK.

When Sophie was about fourteen, she was asked if she wanted to swim train with the elite squad at Loughborough university. This meant regular early mornings and then coming home for breakfast before trundling off to South Wolds Academy where she stayed on for sixth form. She continued her education at Loughborough University to study human biology and enjoyed four years there trying to balance study, training, and competing. Quick fact, If Loughborough University were a country, it be in the top 25 for the medals table at each of the last two Olympic Games!

Anyone involved in sport knows it can bring the highest of highs and the inevitable lows. Sophie has had her share of injuries which are so frustrating as she needs to stop everything, take time to mend, then build back up again - 'it's a process but I'm not the most patient of people.' Sophie said.




She now lives in Loughborough as she trains full-time out of the university with a great bunch of athletes - including another 4Life Tri alumni Liv Mathias and Olympic medallist Alex Yee. She just missed out on an Olympic spot, but did travel out to Tokyo as a reserve which has made her even more determined for Paris.

Her last race of this season was a couple of weeks ago in Abu Dhabi - "I'm really into F1 and was so excited to race on the circuit itself. For the English racers it was part of Commonwealth selection - you had to have a podium at one race in the year (which I had achieved in Leeds) and then podium at Abu Dhabi as well."



"I had a great swim and managed to get in a small breakaway on the bike - which was brutal as there's a young American girl who is an awesome biker - at some points I must have been redlining but with Commonwealth selection at stake there was no way I was being dropped - then onto the run. With the two Olympic medallists pulling away it was down to a run race between me and Jess for automatic selection - at one point she pulled away by about 8 seconds so I had a strict talk to myself and off I went in pursuit. I cannot explain my elation coming down the blue carpet knowing that I'm going to Birmingham next summer to represent England."



Rob said, "this grading was very challenging and very special in so many ways. I am proud and grateful in equal measure - none of it would have been possible without the KUGB's inspirational role models to whom I owe so much."



Christmas Apple And Mincemeat Crumble

850g Bramley apples
2 ripe pears
½ lemon, juice only
250g mincemeat
75g golden caster sugar
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
¼ teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
125g marzipan
FOR THE CRUMBLE
225g plain flour
150g butter, chilled and diced
Pinch salt
50g caster sugar
50g flaked almonds



Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas 4. Peel, quarter and core the apples and pears. Cut the fruit into bite-size pieces and put in a large bowl. Squeeze over the lemon juice and toss the fruit well to coat. Add the mincemeat, sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg and mix again. Cut the marzipan into small dice the size of a raisin and stir into the mixture. Tip into an ovenproof dish, spread evenly and cover with foil. Bake for 10 minutes. For the crumble, tip the plain flour into a large bowl, add the butter and a pinch of salt. Using your fingertips, rub the butter into the flour until it starts to look like sand. Continue rubbing in until the crumble starts to form clumps. Add the sugar and almonds and mix again to combine. Scatter the crumble over the fruit in an even layer. Return to the oven uncovered, and cook for 45 minutes or until the fruit is bubbling and the crumble is golden-brown. Serve with custard or brandy cream. Serves 6

Kath's Recipe

A good cake to keep out the cold, easy to make and keeps well – kath

Yorkshire Parkin

450g Golden Syrup
225g Self Raising Flour
175g Demerara Sugar
225g Butter
3 teasp Ground Ginger
350g Medium Oatmeal
1 Large Egg
½ Pint Milk



Simply put the Syrup, Demerara Sugar, and Butter into a large pan melting slowly, then stir in the SR Flour, Ginger and Oatmeal. Leave to cool and finally add the beaten egg and the milk. Pour into a large rectangular tin 10x12inches or similar. Bake in a slow oven for 1hr – 1½ hrs at Gas 3/170c.

The History of Parkin

The first published dated reference to parkin was collected from 1728 from the West Yorkshire Quarter Sessions when Anne Whittaker was accused of stealing oatmeal to make parkin. The Lancashire schoolmaster and poet Tim Bobbin describes tharf cake in 1740, and this is recognisable as a parkin. A possible older use of parkin is in the seventeenth century ballad 'The song of Arthur O'Bradley' that purports to describe a merry wedding from the time of Robin Hood (fourteenth century)
