

Also, the chef badge elements were covered as the cubs helped to prepare the evening meal and helped to wash up. Everyone had a go at washing up across the weekend, which was a new experience for some. On the Sunday, each cub made their own packed lunch, which made them all the tastier.

By 3pm on Sunday, the boats were moored back up at Castle Wharf and parents were very happy that their children had had lots of fun and the weekend would be one 'the cubs will never forget'.

Fun Run Marathon Challenge

CR#SSDALE)

Mr Sanders has organised our very own children's marathon. Children have been encouraged to take part by completing 1 mile (3 laps of the field) at a time and ticking off each mile as they complete them. There is no time limit and, children are encouraged to take part and run it at their own pace. After 6 miles each child earns a sticker, after 13 miles a run fun band, and after completing the marathon they will receive a medal and certificate.

School Science week

Our Year 1 children have been studying "How does the weather in the UK change throughout the year?" Like proper scientists, they have kept a weather chart on the classroom and observed closely, to see how the weather changes from winter to spring. They also looked at Antarctica, one of the coldest areas of the world, and talked about how the animals stay warm, particularly baby penguins. To investigate this they used two hot water bottles as pretend baby penguins and measured their temperature. They insulated one with cotton wool penguins and a plastic bag and sat



them both outside on ice blocks. We measured the temperature every hour and watched it drop for both penguins, noting that the one that was wrapped up dropped much slower.

Meanwhile, Year 5 have been studying "What are Hormones, and how do they affect our bodies?". They listed their everyday habits on a pie chart, and learned about a few specific hormones which drive our everyday functions. We learned about cortisol (which helps us to wake up), melatonin (which helps us to sleep), ghrelin (which makes us feel hungry, reminding us to eat) and leptin (which makes us feel full).

World Book Day

The children had great fun dressed as witches and wizards as Hogwarts was brought to life at Crossdale! The floating candles in the hall at dinner time were a particular highlight. Our Year 1 class had fun learning to draw a monster like our author of the week Tony Ross, and writing stories about how the witches and wizards could write spells to defeat them! We then visited the village library and Oona showed us how the books are organised and we all chose two books to take home. Then we found a story written by Tony Ross, and Oona finished off our visit by reading it to us.

Building Regulations Part P Approved Hopefully Spring is just around the corner and we can start looking forward to longer warmer days. This is when I get the urge to start baking cakes! Here are a couple of my favourites, both of which are quite easy to make.

STICKY MARMALADE TEALOAF

140g orange marmalade 175g light muscovado sugar 225g self-raising flour 2 teaspoons ground ginger 100g pecan halves

175g butter, softened 3 eggs, beaten
½ teaspoon baking powder 1 teaspoon mixed spice



line it with greaseproof paper. Set aside 1 tablespoon of the marmalade in a small pan. In a bowl, blend the remaining marmalade, butter, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder and spices until smooth and light. Stir in about three quarters of the pecans. Tip into the prepared tin and smooth the top. Sprinkle with the reserved pecans. Bake for about 1-11/4 hours until a skewer inserted comes out clean. Once cooked, carefully remove from the tin and cool slightly on a wire rack. Gently heat the reserved marmalade, stirring until it is smooth, and spread the glaze over the top of the warm loaf. Serve in slices.

ORANGE AND ALMOND CAKE

1 medium orange 175g butter, softened 175g light muscovado sugar 3 eggs 175g self-raising flour ½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 50g ground almonds Icing sugar, for dredging

Preheat oven to 190C/Gas 5. Butter and line the base of a 23cm/9in round deep cake tin. Cut the whole orange (skin, pith, flesh, the lot) into pieces. Remove any pips, then whizz the orange pieces in a food processor to a finely chopped purée. Add the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, bicarbonate of soda and almonds into the processor and whizz for a further 10 seconds, or until smooth. Pour into the prepared tin and smooth the top. Bake for 25-30 minutes, until the cake is risen and brown. Allow to cool in the tin for 5 minutes before turning out on to a wire rack. Sieve the icing sugar on the top.



Easter and Chocolate seem to go together and it will be school holidays too, so here is a couple of recipes - one for the kids and one for the Mums & Dads, so enjoy - Kath Oakley

BANOFFI CREAMS - for the kids

75gr Milk Chocolate 4 tabs Milk 2 x 150ml small pots Low Fat Toffee Yoghurt 150ml Double Cream 2 small Ripe Bananas Some small Chocolate Easter Eggs

Simply chop and melt the chocolate in a bowl, over hot water, stirring gently and when melted stir in the Yoghurt. Lightly whip the cream, slice the bananas and alternate in individual glasses. Finish with a layer of cream and top with small chocolate Easter Eggs - the kids will love making and eating this one.

CHCOLATE CREAM DIP - for the Mums and Dads 200gr Plain Chocolate 4 tabsp Double Cream

4 tabps Orange Liqueur

Dippers:- Sweet Biscuits, Strawberries, Wafer Biscs etc.

Simply melt the Chocolate with the Cream and the Liqueur and stir until smooth. Pour into ramekin dishes, place on a plate and surround with 'dippers' - easy and enjoy.







KEYWORTH LIVES - Rushcliffe Play Forum Volunteer Team

Rushcliffe Play Forum provides a service for the local and wider community. On payment of a very reasonable annual fee their members can attend the Play Forum to collect resources to be creative with. Their membership includes Nurseries, uniformed groups, church groups, schools, care homes, families and individuals. They occasionally support community events by providing and supervising craft activities, utilising our scrap resources.

They also have art and craft resources available at competitive prices as well as a variety of pre-cut shapes, which are a very

popular item. A selection of hire equipment is also available to the members. They are happy for anyone to come in, have a look around and see what they offer, with no obligation.

How did the scrapstore in Keyworth begin?

The Rushcliffe Play Forum started 33 years ago and moved to Keyworth in 2006, from its original base in Wilford.

How do volunteers get involved? Do you need any special skills or experience?

As we are a totally volunteer run organisation we depend on volunteers offering their time to us. They are either introduced to us, hear about us or were involved in organisations that were members and appreciate our value in the community. The main skill required is enthusiasm and flexibility, along with a belief in recycling. Each volunteer brings their own experience and collectively we share the workload that running a scrapstore creates. In return we offer free tea and coffee and friendship.

Have you seen many of the end results from your scrap that goes into creative projects? Are there any particular artworks that stick in your memory

When we support local events we immediately see the results. For many years we attended and provided activities at the annual play event, 'Lark in the Park' and there are memories too numerous to list from those occasions.

With the advent of social media and via our facebook page we actively encourage members to send us photographs of their crafts. We then share them to inspire other members.

Where does the scrap come from and how do you go about letting people know that some rubbish isn't actually rubbish at all?

Scrap is donated by local businesses and individuals. We are particularly fortunate to have a regular supply of ribbon. We also swap our surplus scrap with other scrapstores around the country. This provides a wider variety of resources. We also display potential ideas to use the scrap and provide ideas sheets to show that "one man's rubbish is another man's treasure"

What is the biggest challenge in running an organisation that is based on volunteers and goodwill?

Recruiting enough volunteers is the main challenge. We need a minimum of two every time we open and with all the resources we have to sort extra hands are welcome. We ideally need a number of volunteers to cover for absences and to ensure that no individual volunteer has an excessive commitment. We are open Tuesdays 12-5 and Thursdays 10-4 and invite anyone who may be interested in volunteering, even if only for a few hours, to drop in to the Bungalow, Keyworth Primary School, Nottingham Road, call us on 937 4589 or email rushcliffe.playforum@btopenworld.com.
