2425 (Nottingham Airport) Squadron Air Cadets



The darker nights and cooler temperatures of the last month have seen the Squadron enter our Winter programme of activities on the airfield. The open spaces of the airfield which were used for archery, athletics, orienteering and fieldcraft now hosting the first night exercises of the season. In small teams cadets navigating the airfield, completing the tasks set them and utilising their leadership, radio and compass skills.

The change in season also sees us start to use the classrooms and facilities of our new HQ building to a greater extent. With a recent large intake of new Cadets there are lessons each parade night in the topics required to help these new members of the Squadron learn the skills to assist them get the most from the experiences open to them. From an understanding of ranks and the history of our organisation and the Royal Air Force, to principals of flight, map reading and camp skills. The monthly meeting was held on Thursday, 13th October at the Stanton-on-the-Wolds Golf Club. The meeting started with the RAFA Dedication and was followed by a short remembrance Air Vice Marshal 'Larry' Lamb who died recently aged 99. Having trained as a bomber pilot, he quickly transferred, after the end of WW II, to Transport Command flying the Handley Page Hastings. In 1948-9 he was very much involved in the Berlin Airlift taking food and supplies to the desperately hungry Germans in the Western sectors of Berlin. Later, after several promotions, he commanded a night fighter squadron in Germany flying Javelins.

The meeting continued with a talk by Colin Ferguson. His talk was titled 'My Career in Aviation' and it covered his many years in the RAF as a transport pilot and then his years in civil aviation flying firstly, for Orion Airways and then Britannia Airways based at East Midlands Airport. Colin had a very interesting and varied career which even involved a tour flying with the United States Air Force. The members really enjoyed his excellent talk.

After a short break, the formal meeting went ahead with the usual reports from the members. One was of a visit to the International Bomber Command Centre which is situated on the outskirts of the city of Lincoln. An interesting and enjoyable afternoon was spent touring the site and seeing and hearing the history of Bomber Command from the tour guide.

The next meeting will take place on Thursday, 10th November starting at 7:15pm. The talk will be given by John Stansfield and the title is 'Just Another Trip!', the story of a journey where nearly everything went wrong! If you have a connection with the RAF or the other services or are just interested in the Talk then come along to the golf club where you will be made welcome.

Keyworth Residents Demand Safer Crossings

The Keyworth News Facebook page has received demands for safe pedestrian crossings in our increasingly busy village following a collision involving an 11-year-old girl and a van in Wolds Drive on 10th Oct. 2022. Leanne Didmore has started a petition for a pedestrian crossing at Wolds Drive in Keyworth at Change.org. <https://www.change.org/p/a-pedestrian-crossing-for-wolds-drive-in-keyworth>

Julie: I have lived in Keyworth for 25 years and traffic and parked cars has increased hugely over the last few years. There has always been a demand for zebra crossings around schools where you have highlighted and the top of Bunny Lane. Come on councillors.

Jennifer: The village has increased in size and busyness without extending that to safe pedestrian crossings. I signed something last year to try and get a crossing outside Keyworth Primary. I'm sure others did too. Traffic calming measures help all vulnerable people. I saw an elderly lady on Bunny Lane trying to cross from the housing there towards the access point through the health centre car park on a mobility scooter. That is a natural crossing for someone living there. So maybe a review of what we do have and what we do need. School children can be oblivious to vehicles if they have a bus to catch that is the one thing on their mind. Flashing signage at school times, maybe?

Children can also be smaller and less able to see over vehicles. I understand this young girl was 11. A zig zag crossing that connects the COOP to the bus stop safely, would be my suggestion. Even as an adult it can be difficult to cross at times looking from all directions. I also think that we need to look at ourselves and think about why we have made the village so human unfriendly in terms of access and a battle with traffic. The centre of the village is another case in point plus all the school frontages and down by Sainsburys. I pass on my good wishes to the young girl who must have been completely traumatised by this occurrence and hope she makes a full and speedy recovery.

Sheila: A clear pedestrian controlled zebra crossing might be helpful. Parish Council should debate and consider key crossings, esp those near schools. This has been an issue which has been ignored for years. Maybe an accident might galvanise discussion.

Tim: In the days before this incident I'd been walking and driving around the village and been concerned by the amount of bad driving, poor lane discipline and speeding. I don't know the cause of this incident and make no assumption about it. But as a frequent user of The Parade I'd say 'speeding' is a real issue around there. A two-way speed camera would be useful on Wolds Drive. I hope the victim recovers well and the driver gets over the shock.

Emma: We're struggling to get the numerous dangerous potholes (Keyworth/Bunny Lane so risky to get traction), as well as a petition for a walkway on Platt Lane.

Teri: Action is needed now and don't give up and don't ignore it!





On behalf of Keyworth & District Community Concern (KDCC) I would like to comment on the article on trentbarton's buses in the October Keyworth News, and in particular the reference to the voluntary sector.

KDCC is a small self-financing local Charity and as well as running a weekly Day Centre, we also provide and operate the two silver Keyworth Community minibuses, adapted to carry wheelchair passengers, which can be seen in the village. Our whole service is run by unpaid volunteers and as local residents we sympathise with the calls for regular and reliable bus services.

In addition to collecting particularly elderly and less able local residents from their homes and transporting them to our weekly Day Centre, a Thursday local Shopping trip, and Friendship Club events; our buses are also used by more than 60 local Groups & Societies, who are Members of our Charity. Our bus operator's permit & insurance only allow us to transport local residents as members of groups and societies - we are not permitted to pick up fare-paying individual members of the public.

We are always willing to talk to anyone who might wish to make use of our buses, and we will support the local community wherever possible, as long as this can be managed by our small band of volunteers and is within our legal responsibility. New groups wishing to visit local country parks or garden centres are something we would be pleased to support (group numbers on trips do vary from 6 to 32) - what we are unable to provide with our existing permits and volunteer structure is a round-village passenger pick up service or a scheduled bus service as operated by trentbarton.

Details of what we are doing as a Charity and contact information can be read in our monthly Keyworth News article.

Readers' Letters Continued...

We have lived in Keyworth for twenty-three years and were delighted with the bus service in the early years (you could set your watch by their timetable). Over the past six years or so, the service has been in decline and despite contacting Trentbarton, the Parish Council and local Councillors, we are no nearer to the service we received in the early days.

There are numerous occasions where we have missed trains and appointments. We have waited at bus stops for nearly an hour and watched three buses pass in the opposite direction within fifteen minutes. We have travelled from Nottingham to Keyworth and at Edwalton Garden Centre the driver asked us to get off and wait for the next bus, so he could travel around Edwalton roundabout back to Nottingham without travelling to Keyworth.

We do not use a mobile phone or social media, so we rely on the electronic display at the bus stop, which seems to have a mind of its own, changing from "Due in 2 mins" to "Due in 15 mins". Not good when passengers are already frustrated.

We use the village hoppers such as 853 to Tollerton, Morrisons, West Bridgford and 863 to Ruddington and surrounding villages. From West Bridgford we catch the many reliable buses to Nottingham Victoria Centre.

Trentbarton used to run a service along Nicker Hill/Willow Brook to Nottingham via Asda. To travel round the village for shopping or doctors, get off at the bottom of Nicker Hill/Normanton Lane, and catch the return bus on Nicker Hill/Platts Lane. It is not a good solution but it saves going into Nottingham and back.

Trentbarton have had serious problems for many years which have not been solved so, change timetables at bus stops and re-organise to every 20/30 minutes, giving the drivers more time to keep to timetable.

We would not object to the new timetable if we knew the bus was on time, instead of keeping angry passengers waiting at bus stops not knowing.

Have Trentbarton considered what will happen when all 650 new homes are built?

A Response to October Readers' Letters from KDCC

On behalf of Keyworth & District Community Concern (KDCC) I would like to comment on the article on trentbarton's buses in the October Keyworth News, and in particular the reference to the voluntary sector.

KDCC is a small self-financing local Charity and as well as running a weekly Day Centre, we also provide and operate the two silver Keyworth Community minibuses, adapted to carry wheelchair passengers, which can be seen in the village. Our whole service is run by unpaid volunteers and as local residents we sympathise with the calls for regular and reliable bus services.

In addition to collecting particularly elderly and less able local residents from their homes and transporting them to our weekly Day Centre, a Thursday local Shopping trip, and Friendship Club events; our buses are also used by more than 60 local Groups & Societies, who are Members of our Charity. Our bus operator's permit & insurance only allow us to transport local residents as members of groups and societies - we are not permitted to pick up fare-paying individual members of the public.

We are always willing to talk to anyone who might wish to make use of our buses, and we will support the local community wherever possible, as long as this can be managed by our small band of volunteers and is within our legal responsibility. New groups wishing to visit local country parks or garden centres are something we would be pleased to support (group numbers on trips do vary from 6 to 32) - what we are unable to provide with our existing permits and volunteer structure is a round-village passenger pick up service or a scheduled bus service as operated by trentbarton.

Barry's Recipes

In answer to Margie's letter (see my reply) here is one of my favourite fish recipes. While it is quite easy to do, I so enjoy the flavours which do not override the fish. Happy cooking, Barry

Chorizo Crumbed Cod Loin, Pepper And Olive Traybake

250g new or baby potatoes, halved if too large

1 tablespoon olive oil

60g chorizo, chopped

40g breadcrumbs (if possible use stale bread)

grated zest and juice of 1 lemon

15g mature cheddar cheese, grated

200g red pepper, roughly chopped

2 cod loins, 175g each

50g pitted green olives, halved or sliced

chopped fresh flatleaf parsley



Heat the oven to 220°C/Gas 7. In a roasting tin, toss the new potatoes in the olive oil, season with salt and pepper, then place in the oven for 25 minutes. Heat a frying pan, add the chorizo and cook for 4-5 minutes until it has released most of its oil. Add the breadcrumbs, then cook for another 3-4 minutes until crisp. Transfer to a food processor with the lemon zest and cheddar, then whizz to fine crumbs. Add the chopped pepper to the potatoes in the roasting tin, toss to coat in the oil, then roast for a further 15 minutes. Toss the cod loins in the lemon juice, then spoon over the chorizo crumb mix, pressing down to make a crust on top of each piece of cod. Put the fish on top of the vegetables in the roasting tin, then return to the oven for a further 10-15 minutes or until the fish is cooked through. Scatter over the olives and parsley and serve. Serves 2 but can easily be doubled for 4. Wine to accompany this dish could be a full flavoured dry rosé.



KEYWORTH COMMUNITY GARDEN

October saw our first visitors to the Community Garden, and we are now welcoming volunteers every Tuesday from 10 am. We have started planting whilst the soil is still warm, although this is quite a challenge in the compacted soil. These small steps are key to starting to provide habitat for wildlife and encouraging biodiversity in the area. Our vision is for the garden to be a beautiful and diverse space, not just an allotment, that benefits wildlife and nature as well as those who visit.

We know that many people take a great pride in their gardens, with hedges, lawns and beds neatly trimmed, but for wildlife, consider keeping a small untidy area in your garden by creating a pile of leaves, vegetation, logs and twigs, and this will be the perfect place for hedgehogs and amphibians to hibernate, as well as providing habitat for overwintering insects.

GARDEN JOBS FOR NOVEMBER

Leaf mould is a valuable soil conditioner so consider making your own from fallen leaves.

Plant tulip bulbs now. Planting them late is a means of disease protection.

Prune roses to prevent wind-rock.

Fewer hours of daylight means wild birds have less time to forage. However, if you put out bird food do be consistent.

Plant bare root hedges, evergreens, & trees whilst the soil is still warm.

Garlic can still be planted as it needs a cold period to develop its clusters of bulbs.

Sowing broad beans in November can bring your harvest forward by a few weeks next year.

What to look out for this month...

Ivy berries appearing in November & December are a superfood for birds & last late into the winter.

Check bonfires before lighting for hedgehogs & toads that may be inside, ready for hibernation.

Fully grown fox cubs, fed & protected by adults since birth, venture out alone.

The red admiral will be the last butterfly seen in the year & often the first in the next.

Snail slime forms a seal across the shell opening to stop the animal inside drying out whilst it becomes inactive until Spring.

As hedgerows die back, the shiny bright red berries of the vine-like black bryony become visible, but they are very poisonous so best left alone.



I was born in Dublin, Ireland; both my parents were Dubliners. My family arrived in Nottingham in 1968 when I was nine years old. I went to Saint Mary's School, Derby Road, and from there I went to Bishop Dunn, Secondary School, in Aspley. While at school I felt God was calling me to religious life and after I left in 1975, I went to train as a chef at Nazareth House, Nottingham. In my final year I felt I had to answer God's call and so I entered the Hospitaller Order of Saint John of God on the 29th Sept 1978.



After completing my discernment, noviciate, simple and solemn profession, I attained my degree, a BSc. Diploma in Social Work, and served as The Provincial of the English Province for 12 years. I felt the call to priesthood within my call as a Brother of Saint John of God. The Order did not wish, at that time, to ordain any more Brothers to the priesthood and so with a heavy heart I left the Order to follow God's call into the Diocesan Priesthood.

I studied at Oscott Seminary, Birmingham and was ordained to the Sacred Priesthood on 13th July 2013 by Bishop Malcom McMahon OP. After Ordination, Bishop Malcom appointed me his Chaplain to the Youth Service, where I spent two very happy years. I had never worked with young people before; all my 33 years of working life in the Order were spent looking after adults or in administration. In the very short 9 years I have been a Priest, I have worked in various parishes and on the 1st Sept 2022, Bishop Patrick assigned me the task of overseeing the amalgamation of four original parishes, St Margaret Clitherow being one of those, into one new parish.

To relax, I enjoy walking, reading, listening to Irish folk music, cooking when I can, and going for a gentle bike ride! I am not a football fan, so you don't have to worry about Leicester, Forest or County, with me! I will always be ready to console you though!

My overriding passion, however, is to walk beside others on their Christian Journey, to inspire, support, be present, to listen and together encounter Christ in each other, to be bold and to be Missionary, outward looking and to build up the Kingdom of God in our community. I look forward to not only getting to know my new parishioners but also in meeting others ecumenically, promoting and sharing unity among all our brothers and sisters from other Christian traditions.

Over this half-term, Year 4 have been learning all about crime and punishment throughout time, so they were very excited to find out that they were going to take a trip to the National Justice Museum in Nottingham.

They started the day by travelling back to the Georgian period and went down to the old prison cells underneath the museum. Whilst they were there, they got to meet a prison guard (who was quite scary). He treated them all like prisoners and told them all about the different punishments they would have used. He explained to the children that prisoners would spend up to 9 months in one of the cells before they would be transported to Australia or America. The children found it even more fascinating when they found out that prisoners had to pay to be in prison!



They then travelled to Victorian times and met a matron, who told them all about how men and woman prisoners were separate. After this, they looked around a woman's cell and found out that all women would have their hair cut to their shoulders, and they would use the hair for the mattress that they slept on! They also learnt that they would only get clean clothes once a month!

Next, they went and explored some punishments throughout time: this is where the children got to learn all about the stocks, branding, scold bridle and even got to put their head inside a real stock. The children found the branding irons the most disturbing and decided that this was one of the worst punishments.

After lunch, the children got into character, dressed up and acted out a court scene in a real courtroom, where they all decided that Emmeline Pankhurst was guilty of her crimes and sentenced her to 9 months in prison! The children had a wonderful time and were an asset to our school. We even received a phone call from the National Justice Museum saying how well behave and polite the children were! Well done Andersen Class- we are so proud that we won't be 'branding' you all... Yet!! 😊

Toys from the past!



This week Year 1 had an amazing visit from Tommy Top Hat! We had a fantastic day exploring the toys from the past, finding out how they worked, what they were made of and how old they were. We started off the day by exploring playground toys such as a hoop rolling, quoits, ribbon sticks, marbles... we had great fun running around testing our skills with these games.



We then returned to the classroom and explored some of the toys children may have at home. We really enjoyed playing with the tabletop bagatelle and metal spinning tops! After lunch, we finished off our visit with some fun parlour games (games families used to play after dinner parties!). We loved playing 'poor kitty', 'the minister's cat' and 'what are you thinking?'

Most of the toys we played with were either made from wood, metal or string and they were push and pull toys. Some of the toys we explored looked very similar to the toys we may have at home but were made of different materials. It was a great experience for all the children!



Wild Things Keyworth

As I pressed send on the entry for the competition to find Britain's Biggest Hedgehog Street, I felt Keyworth, or more specifically, Dale Road, stood a good chance. Earlier in the summer the national organisations of BHPS, PTES and Hedgehog Street launched a competition 'right up our street' as it were, and I immediately set to work.

As you know Wild Things Keyworth has been drilling gaps for hedgehogs around the village and logging them on the national database since July 2021. So, this was a new venture, concentrating on and inspiring one road. Which would it be? Was it even possible? I realised it was a big ask in the timeframe. So I cycled round with handwritten postcards to all the established Super Hedgehog Carers in the village asking them if they would like to give it a go.

In the end we decided to concentrate our efforts on Dale Road. Earlier in April I'd established Rachel as Dale's Super Hedgehog Carer. Her household received gaps, feed station, hedgehog house, and hedgehog support items courtesy of the funding I gained from Severn Trent on their Boost for Biodiversity scheme for my project Keyworth Hedgehog Highways.

We also filmed hedgehog activity at her newly holed gate. This footage undoubtedly excited neighbours that these gaps really did work and that by doing similar, they too could have their own visiting wild hedgehogs. The idea was that if we could inspire Rachel, she too could pass the inspiration forward. And she did, marvelously!

From our experience, the lead time for this competition was extremely short. We knew that to stand any chance we would need to work swiftly. So on one evening alone, Rachel had managed to set up 4 garden visits via the magic of Whatsapp and that was a great start.

Gill and I were able to talk through all the options with the residents with a view to coming back and drilling at a later date with Nick. What was also fantastic during the 3 month period is that some neighbours were starting to make gaps and gap decorations themselves and so it became a real team effort and those individual efforts made me feel really proud that Keyworth was starting to understand what was at stake.

The gap surrounds Wild Things Keyworth can add, are made from repurposed wood by retired dentist Simon Dunstan and then uniquely adorned by Liz Waddell Artist. These have been enjoyed by children and adults alike and have really pulled the project together. I also handed out BHPS green plaques which are promises to keep gaps open to formalise any gaps with a suitable 13cm clearance.

We have been in various national media since the win for Dale Road. I have even been on TV speaking to veteran newscaster Alistair Stewart who loves hedgehogs too.

Keyworth as a whole is now being seen as a leader in hedgehog infrastructure and understanding, and long may it continue into the future. Wild Things Keyworth will certainly keep going. The competition is a junction point of a much bigger journey for us, and I hope to see you along it. But what an accolade for the village! Keyworth, Home to Britain's Biggest Hedgehog Street! Who'd have thought it :-)




